

COSTUMING

- a. Participant(s) will provide their own costumes (subject to approval by the Vendor Coordinator).
- b. All costumes worn by participants must be appropriate to the Renaissance theme and family nature of the event.
- c. Any participant wearing costume items that are deemed inconsistent with policy will be contacted and asked to modify the items of concern. It is expected that the participant will cause these modifications immediately.
- d. SHOES- Unless otherwise approved by Faire management, shoes are to be worn by all participants during all public festival hours (tennis shoes, combat boots or otherwise modern footwear are UNACCEPTABLE unless feet are concealed by tables or displays). No bare feet.
- e. TIGHTS- Tights should be of a period nature. Stretch velvet is fine also. There should be no prints or shiny spandex tights. Tights with “cut-away” sections or holes and lace panels are also prohibited.
- f. WATCHES- Wristwatches are not to be worn openly, but may be concealed under costume.
- g. MEN- Shirts or vests are to be worn during all public festival hours. Going “Bare-chested” is unacceptable and inappropriate to the family nature of the show.
- h. WOMEN- Ladies’ costumes should be of an appropriately modest nature for a family show. Bodices must be appropriately secure and modest. Some cleavage is fine, however the bust should not be “spilling out” or hang over the top of the bodice.
- i. JEWELRY- Jewelry of an obscene or offensive nature is prohibited and unacceptable to the artistic representation of our 16th century English village.
- j. SMOKING- No one will smoke in sight of any Guest while in costume and during festival hours. Please be discreet (smoke in non-public areas. Holding the cigarette behind one’s back is not discreet.) If a Faire staff member is in a public area of the festival and sees an individual smoking, that person will be considered in violation.
