Math (MA.912.A.2.1, MA.912.A.1.5, MA.912.A.2.4)

1. There are 24 different acts (one or more people doing a routine) scheduled on six stages. Each act runs for thirty minutes. Performances take place during the faire hours of 10AM to 6 PM. No act can perform on the same stage twice. Make a schedule for the acts to follow. Label the acts a-x. What is the maximum number of performances for all acts to perform the same number of times?
2. In 1580, last year, Lily the Pink's age was two more than five times the sum of Wee Mary and Molly Mary's ages together. Molly Mary is two years older than Wee Mary and the sum of their ages was 6, in 1579. This year, 1581, Lily the Pink's age is seven less than six times the sum of Wee Mary and Molly Mary's ages. How old was each in 1580 and 5081?
3. Because of the deplorable state of the water in England, distillation was necessary in order to survive. The average person drank 11 pints of small ale per day. If the village had 47 people in it, how many liters of small ale would they drink per day?
4. The Queen travels with an entourage of people. She has four ladies in waiting who each have a dresser, a maid of all work and a groomsmen. Each carriage has a coachman, a piquer, and four outriders and can accommodate four passengers. If it costs \$10.00 per day for each person in the entourage how much money does a week long excursion cost the Queen?
5. A messenger was sent on horseback from London to Lady Bess' estate with a missive from The Queen. He was told to go as fast as he could. His horse was able to run for thirty miles per day. In order to cover the 144 mile distance how days did it take him to get there?
6. In Discover Shrewsbury the survival rate of infants is 63% in the first year. If there are 23 babies born annually how many of them celebrate their first birthday?
7. The average cat has a litter of litter in 65 days that is an adult size in eight months. Cat pelts are an average of 7" by 5.5 inches and sell for \$6.00 per pelt. A stole takes eleven pelts to make. If a Skinner wants to make \$10,000 per year, how many cat pelts would he need to sell? How many cats would he need to raise? For every ten cats add three more for breeders.
8. Milk maids milked cows twice a day. A typical milkmaid milks four cows per session. Each cow produces about a gallon of milk per milking. In order to have fifty gallons of milk per day for the village how many milkmaids does the village need to have?
9. The village stalls are 8X4 linear feet each. There are 11 stalls in the village. If a walk way of three feet must separate each stall how many linear feet of space do we need?

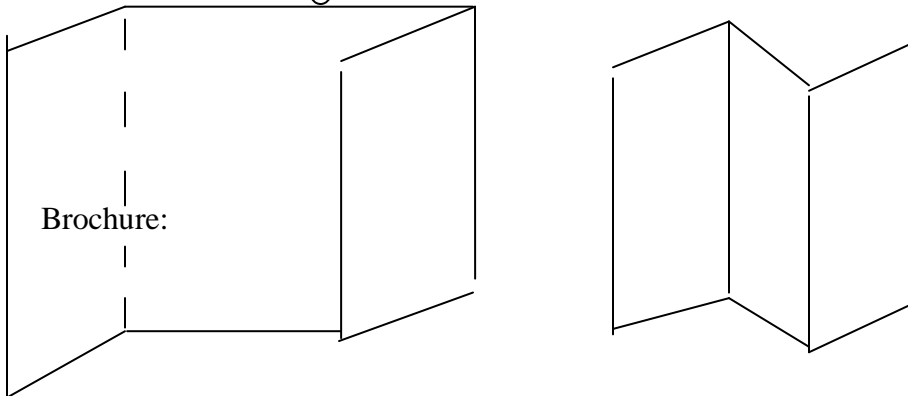
